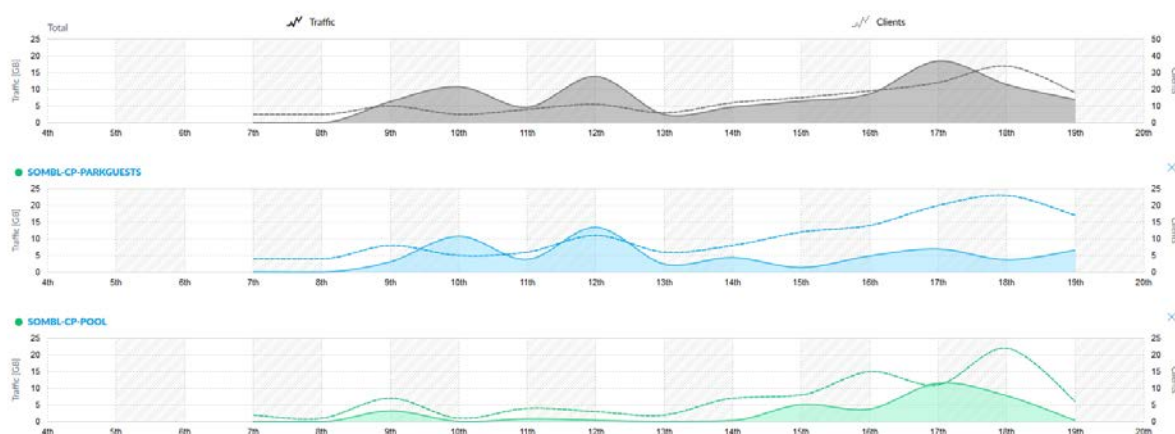

Mukinbudin Swimming Pool Report – November 2018

- The Pool season opened on the 3rd November with 74 through the gate on opening day.
- Numbers have been steady with most days around 50 people, a minimum of 14, maximum of 106 (excluding swimming lessons).
- Swimming lessons for Muka, Bencubbin and Beacon were held over 2 weeks from the 26th November through to December 7th. The Pool was opened early (9am) to accommodate the extra numbers. Approximately 120 children per day were involved in lessons.
- Events being held at the Pool include Youth Group, MDHS Water Polo and Swimming Club each Tuesday.
- The Pool is currently at 27 degrees, optimal for swimmers.
- The newly installed sea container situated in the spare yard in late November has been a welcome addition. The Chemical Shed now meets safety standards and the First Aid Room is no longer needed as storage.

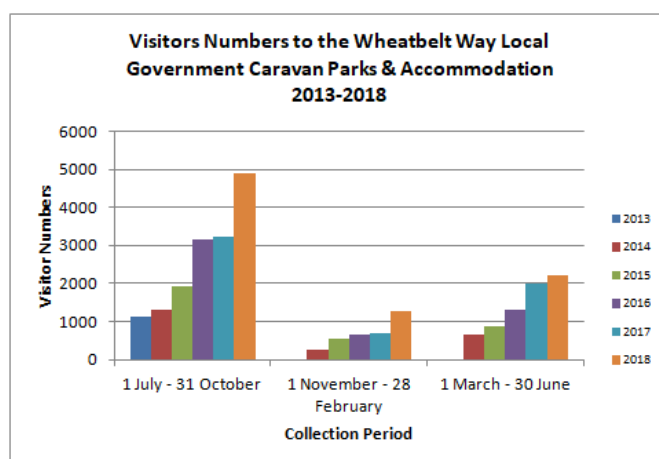


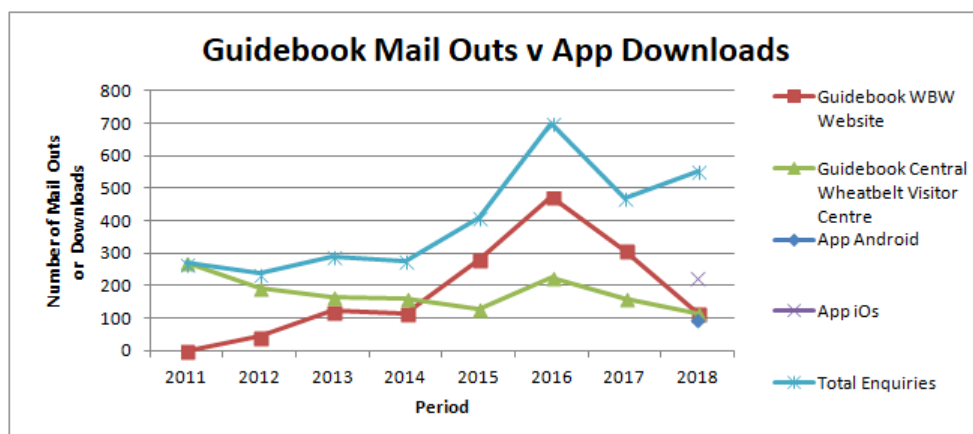
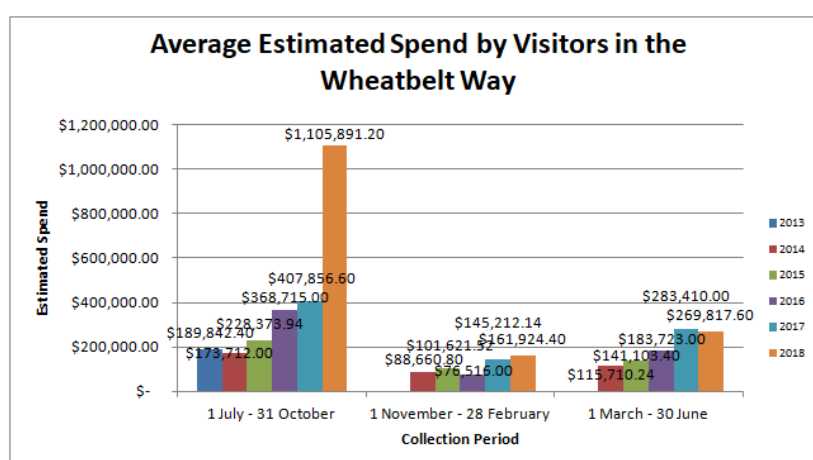
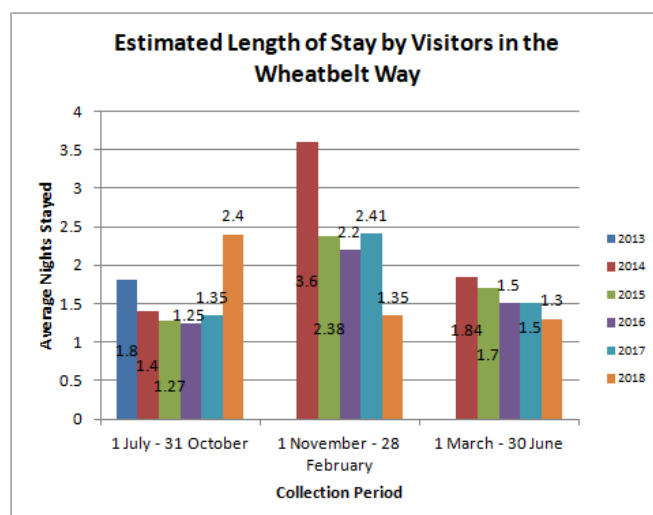
Wheatbelt Way

OUR BIGGEST YEAR

From 1 November 2017 to 31 October 2018 at least 8,386 people stayed an average of 1.6 nights in local government caravans parks across the Wheatbelt Way. This has been the **MOST** number of annual visitors to the Wheatbelt Way to date - CONGRATULATIONS!





Wheatbelt Way Visitor Statistics Summary 1 July 2018 - 31 October 2018

- 1 July 2018- 31 October 2018 saw a total of 4,902 visitors stay in local government accommodation in the Wheatbelt Way.

The following caravan parks saw the most number of visitors - **EVER** stay with them during this period:

- Mukinbudin Caravan Park - 1,471 visitors**

- They stayed an average of 2.4 nights per town in the Wheatbelt Way.
- It is estimated that this led to an estimated \$1,105,891.20 of direct “new” money generated by tourist spending in Wheatbelt Way communities and an indirect multiplier effect of \$3,317,673.60 to our communities during these months.
- **Beacon** Caravan Park and Barracks - 1,325 visitors
- **Westonia** Caravan Park - 885 visitors
- **Koorda** Caravan Park and Yalambee Units - 353 visitors
- **Nungarin** Caravan Park - 301 visitors

Congratulations and well done to you - I'm sure that you all "felt" this increase in visitor numbers.

This was also the highest number of visitors to visit the Wheatbelt Way since we begun collecting statistics in 2013.

Water pressure changes in Mukinbudin

Managing water pressure is becoming a major part of Water Corporation's efforts to use scarce water resources more efficiently at a time when rainfall is decreasing and we move towards more sustainable, climate-resilient supply schemes.

Mukinbudin town currently receives unusually high water pressure and as you may know, residents often experience supply interruptions from leaks and breaks in the pipe network.

To improve the reliability of supply and to prevent water losses through scheme leaks and bursts, we will be reducing the pressure in the Mukinbudin town. This will see fewer supply interruptions and reduce costs associated with building and maintaining water supply schemes.

Your water pressure will be gradually reduced to a more standard level. We will undertake the reduction in stages to ensure the impact of the changes are minimised. The stepped reductions are expected to begin in Mukinbudin town at the end of January 2019.

The pressure will be reduced gradually to 30 metres head over a period of four months. While you may notice changes, customers will continue to receive more than adequate water flow to meet their needs. 30 metres head is double the minimum pressure we are required to supply our customers and adequate for common household appliances and irrigation systems.

Please refer to the enclosed information sheet for further information.

I hope you'll welcome these changes and look forward to helping us save Western Australia's precious and scarce water supplies.
