Summary

To present Council with the proposed Fees & Charges for 2019/20 for approval.

Background Information

Previous presentation of the fees and charges presented to council on 20 August 2019. Concerns over housing rental income were raised and the fees and changes presented were not adopted.

Officer Comment

General

Each year Council is required to review the annual fees and charges which are incorporated into the Annual Budget Document. Fees and Charges for a small Wheatbelt Shire such as Mukinbudin represent a very small portion of income on a percentage basis of the total annual income. In a lot of cases, budgeted income amounts for 2019/20 have remained the same as 2018/19, meaning any increases in additional revenue will have a minimal impact.

The 2019/20 Schedule of Fees and Charges have been reviewed and prepared by the Administration to include, but not limited to, the following changes:

- A general increase in 2% across the fees and charges to account for CPI.
- Update of Statutory Health & Building Fees & Charges.
- Swimming Pool Admissions, Events Kit Hire charges, District Club accounting service charges and Caravan Park accommodation fees have remained the same.
- Review and Update of Plant and Material Charges; Set hourly rate for Labour hire of \$55.00
- Gym Membership removal of ½ yearly and weekly membership replaced with monthly membership for single only.
- Gym Bond removal of the Bond fee, replaced with Card fee for first time members and replace of lost card.
- Photocopying and other similar Admin charges reduced to match current CRC charges.
- Mobility Scooter (Gopher) hire charges increased to \$70 per week.
- Inclusion of sales of reprinted history book at \$30 per book (plus postage if required).
- All housing rents reviewed to adhere to what is perceived to be market value.

Market Value Housing Rent Determination

Subsequent to the presentation of the 2019-2020 Fees and Charges to council on the methodology of determining the housing rental being charged and to be charged was reviewed.

The market value for rental in Merredin and Northam for June 2019 was been investigated and the results are as follows:

- Merredin 3 bedroom \$280
- Northam 2 bedroom \$250
- Northam 3 bedroom \$275
- Northam 4 bedroom \$345

These values along with the size and condition of our properties has been used to determine the "Market Value" for our properties in Mukinbudin.

These values are used to determine the starting point for any rental agreement and would apply to any tenant if no other agreement or conditions were applicable. A list giving the Mukinbudin "Market Value" is below.

Summary

Council is requested to consider adopting Rates and associated Fees and Charges for 2019-2020 in compliance with the Local Government Act 1995 (LGA) and Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996.

Background Information

Budget by Schedule for the Period Ended 30 June 2020 reviewed by council on 20 August 2019 and subsequently reviewed and modified to incorporate the following changes:

- Inclusion of North East Road (Subject to approval of the additional Roads To Recovery). A \$85K capital expense increase.
- Additional Roads To Recovery \$85K funding.
- Inclusion of \$10K for community grants. An increase in expense of \$10K. (See account 2040115 in "Members".)
- Removal of Scotsman Road from the 2019-2020 road program and the reallocation of resources. A reduction of \$30K in capital expense.
- Reduction in the General Purpose component of the FAGs Grant. A reduction of \$4,951 in general purpose income.
- Reduction in the Local Roads component of the FAGs Grant. A reduction of \$7,175 in road income.
- A review of the Administration Staff Accommodation Allowance. A reduction in expense of approximately \$3K.
- Reduction in worked hours of the Works Supervisor. A reduction in expense of approximately \$8K.
- Reduction in road plant tyres expense. A reduction in expense of approximately \$5K.
- Recognition of additional standpipe water income to used on Rural Road Maintenance. An increase in income of \$5K.
- An increase in the allocation of expenditure on Rural Road Maintenance. An increase in expenditure of \$13.5K. This includes the reallocation of water and some of the resources previously allocated to Scotsman Road.
- Other minor expenditure adjustments to balance resources.

Officer Comment

Overall Rates income is budgeted to increase $6.45\,\%$ through a 7.5% average increase in rates based on Unimproved Valuations. The Unimproved Valuations increase comprised two components, a total UV property values increase of 5.9% and UV rate in the dollar increase of 1.6% yielding an average UV rate increase of 7.5%.

No change in Minimum rates or Gross Rental Value rate in the \$ were made.

The rate increases were made in accordance with the Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) to correct the disparity between the total of GRV and UV rates raised initiated in the 2008-2009 financial year when the GRV rates raised increased by 44.9% whilst UV rates effectively remained unchanged. This is achieved by increasing the UV rates income over the first 6 years of the plan without any increase to the GRV Rates as adopted on 19th June 2019.

The budget has provision charge increases which including:

- Electricity supply charge increase 4% to 243% and consumption increase 4%
- Water service charges and consumption increase 2.5%
- ESL increase 2.75% increase for water rates and consumption.

Staff are currently reviewing our Tariff plans with our electricity supplier Synergy.

The proposed budget for 2019-2020 provides for \$20,000 plus interest to be transferred to the Swimming Pool Reserve.

The proposed budget for 2019-2020 provides for a transfer of \$85K plus interest to be transferred to the Plant Reserve. \$290K is transferred from reserve to purchase a replacement grader.

The rate increase will go a little of the way towards improving our Operating Surplus Ratio however it still expected to be reported as part of a significant adverse trend in the financial position of the shire at the 30 June 2020.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The budget has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities) and interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, and the Local Government Act 1995 and accompanying regulations. The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 take precedence over Australian Accounting Standards. Regulation 16 prohibits a local government from recognising as assets Crown land that is a public thoroughfare, such as land under roads, and land not owned by but under the control or management of the local government, unless it is a golf course, showground, racecourse or recreational facility of State or regional significance. Consequently, some assets, including land under roads acquired on or after 1 July 2008, have not been recognised in this budget. This is not in accordance with the requirements of AASB 1051 Land Under Roads paragraph 15 and AASB 116 Property, Plant and Equipment paragraph 7.

Accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this budget have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the budget has been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPORTING ENTITY

All funds through which the Shire of Mukinbudin controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in the financial statements forming part of this budget.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those Funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the financial statements. A separate statement of those monies appears at Note 13 to the budget.

2018/19 ACTUAL BALANCES

Balances shown in this budget as 2018/19 Actual are estimates as forecast at the time of budget preparation and are subject to final adjustments.

CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

On the 1 July 2019 the following new accounting policies are to be adopted and have impacted on the preparation of the budget:

AASB 15 - Revenue from Contracts with Customers;

AASB 16 - Leases; and

AASB 1058 - Income of Not-for-Profit Entities.

Explanation of the changes arising from these standards is provided at Note 15.

KEY TERMS AND DEFINITIONS - NATURE OR TYPE

REVENUES

RATES

All rates levied under the *Local Government Act 1995*. Includes general, differential, specified area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears, service charges and sewerage rates.

SERVICE CHARGES

Service charges imposed under Division 6 of Part 6 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. Regulation 54 of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* identifies these as television and radio broadcasting, underground electricity and neighbourhood surveillance services.

Excludes rubbish removal charges. Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

PROFIT ON ASSET DISPOSAL

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

REVENUES (CONTINUED)

OPERATING GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

NON-OPERATING GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

FEES AND CHARGES

Revenue (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, sewerage rates, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

INTEREST EARNINGS

Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

OTHER REVENUE / INCOME

Other revenue, which can not be classified under the above headings, includes dividends, discounts, and rebates. Reimbursements and recoveries should be separated by note to ensure the correct calculation of ratios.

EXPENSES

EMPLOYEE COSTS

All costs associated with the employment of person such as salaries, wages, allowances, benefits such as vehicle and housing, superannuation, employment expenses, removal expenses, relocation expenses, worker's compensation insurance, training costs, conferences safety expenses, medical examinations, fringe benefit tax, etc.

MATERIALS AND CONTRACTS

All expenditures on materials, supplies and contracts not classified under other headings. These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as contract services, consultancy, information technology, rental or lease expenditures.

UTILITIES (GAS, ELECTRICITY, WATER, ETC.)

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

INSURANCE

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

LOSS ON ASSET DISPOSAL

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets includes loss on disposal of long term investments.

DEPRECIATION ON NON-CURRENT ASSETS

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

INTEREST EXPENSES

Interest and other costs of finance paid, including costs of finance for loan debentures, overdraft accommodation and refinancing expenses.

OTHER EXPENDITURE

Statutory fees, taxes, provision for bad debts, member's fees or State taxes. Donations and subsidies made to community groups.

KEY TERMS AND DEFINITIONS - REPORTING PROGRAMS

GENERAL PURPOSE FUNDING

To collect revenue to allow for the provision of services.

LAW, ORDER, PUBLIC SAFETY

To provide services to ensure a safer community.

HEALTH

To provide an operational framework for good community health.

EDUCATION AND WELFARE

To provide appropriate care to the aged and disabled.

HOUSING

To provide adequate staff and community housing.

COMMUNITY AMENITIES

Provide services required by the Community.

RECREATION AND CULTURE

To establish and manage efficiently infrastructure and resources which will help the social well being of the community.

TRANSPORT

To provide effective and efficient transport services to the Community.

ECONOMIC SERVICES

To help promote the shire and improve its economic wellbeing.

OTHER PROPERTY AND SERVICES

The provision of private works to the public and the maintenance of cost pools for plant, operating, public works overheads and administration costs

ACTIVITIES

Administration and operation of facilities and services to members of Council; other costs that relate to the task of assisting elected members and reatepayers on matters which do not concern specific council services.

Rates, general purpose government grants and interest revenue.

Supervision of various by-laws, fire prevention, emergency services and animal control.

Food quality and pest control, immunisation services, inspection of abattior and operation of child health clinic.

Provision of Home and Community Care, maintenance to playgroup and community resource centre buildings.

Maintenance of Staff and community housing, collection of various rents.

Rubbish collection services, operation of tips, noise control, administration of the town planning scheme, maintenance of cemeteries, storm water drainage maintenance.

Maintenance of halls, the aquatic centre, recreation centres and various reserves; operation of library.

Construction and maintenance of streets, roads, bridges, cleaning and lighting of streets, depot maintenance and airstrip maintenance.

The regulation and provision of tourism, area promotion, building control, noxious weeds, vermin control and standpipes.

Private Works Operations, plant repairs and operation costs.

(iii) Reason for adjustment to Adjusted net current assets - surplus/(deficit) on 1 July 2019

The Shire has elected to retrospectively apply the cumulative effect of applying AASB 1058 Income of Not-for-Profit Entities at the date of initial application of the standard, being 1 July 2019. The impact of applying the standard was to recognise unspent grants and contributions for construction of recognisable non-financial assets controlled by the Shire as a liability. The opening budgeted surplus/deficit on 1 July 2019 has been amended accordingly from the estimated actual closing surplus/deficit. Refer to note 15 for further explanation of the impact of the changes in accounting policies

2 (c). NET CURRENT ASSETS (CONTINUED)

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

CURRENT AND NON-CURRENT CLASSIFICATION

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Shire's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for sale where it is held as non-current based on the Shire's intentions to release for sale.

TRADE AND OTHER PAYABLES

Trade and other payables represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Shire prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Shire of Mukinbudin becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured, are recognised as a current liability and are normally paid within 30 days of recognition.

CONTRACT ASSETS

A contract asset is the right to consideration in exchange for goods or services the entity has transferred to a customer when that right is conditioned on something other than the passage of time.

PROVISIONS

Provisions are recognised when the Shire has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

INVENTORIES

General

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Superannuation

The Shire of Mukinbudin contributes to a number of superannuation funds on behalf of employees.

All funds to which the Shire of Mukinbudin contributes are defined contribution plans.

TRADE AND OTHER RECEIVABLES

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from ratepayers for unpaid rates and service charges and other amounts due from third parties for goods sold and services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Collectability of trade and other receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectible.

CONTRACT LIABILITIES

An entity's obligation to transfer goods or services to a customer for which the entity has received consideration (or the amount is due) from the customer. Grants to acquire or construct recognisable non-financial assets to be controlled by the Shire are recognised as a liability until such time as the Shire satisfies its obligations under the agreement.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Shire of Mukinbudin's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Shire of Mukinbudin's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as a part of current trade and other payables in the statement of financial position. The Shire of Mukinbudin's obligations for employees' annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as provisions in the statement of financial position.

LAND HELD FOR RESALE

Land held for development and sale is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development, borrowing costs and holding costs until completion of development. Finance costs and holding charges incurred after development is completed are expensed.

Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss at the time of signing an unconditional contract of sale if significant risks and rewards, and effective control over the land, are passed on to the buyer at this point.

Land held for sale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

3. RECONCILIATION OF CASH

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICES

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, cash at bank, deposits available on demand with banks, other short term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and bank overdrafts.

LEASES

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows.

On 1 July 2019 the prepaid rates were recognised as a financial asset and a related amount was recognised as a financial liability and no income was recognised by the Shire of Mukinbudin. When the taxable event occurs the financial liability is extinguished and the Shire of Mukinbudin recognises income for the prepaid rates that have not been refunded.

Assets that were acquired for consideration that was significantly less than fair value principally to enable the Shire of Mukinbudin to further its objectives may have been measured on initial recognition under other Australian Accounting Standards at a cost that was signification less than fair value. Such assets are not required to be remeasured at fair value.

Volunteer Services in relation to Volunteer Fire Services have been recognised in budgeted revenue and budgeted expenditure as the fair value of the services can be reliably estimated and the services would have been purchased if they had not been donated.
